A member of the Boston Park League Hall of Fame, he was also a past chairman of the graduate athletic board at Boston College.

He leaves many nephews and nieces.

A funeral Mass will be said tomorrow at 10 a.m. in St. Francis Xavier Cabrini Church in Scituate. The principal celebrant will be Cardinal Bernard Law. Burial will be in St. Joseph Cemetery in West Roxbury.
